The score, approximately five times lower than the average steel erection contractor, affirms National and Steel City’s commitment to safety as a company value.

The company also highlighted its extremely competitive Experience Modification Rate (EMR) as an example of its commitment to continuous safety excellence. A competitive, or low, EMR means a lower cost for workers compensation insurance and cost savings for customers.

“We employ only the most qualified safety managers on our construction projects, all of whom report directly to me and I am personally involved in reviewing our daily safety reports,” said National Steel Constructors CEO Bob Dunn. “Thanks to our important alliance with FDRsafety, we’ve not only built and perpetuated an outstanding safety track record, but instilled a culture of safety that helps us remain competitive for our customers and ahead of the curve as a company.”
